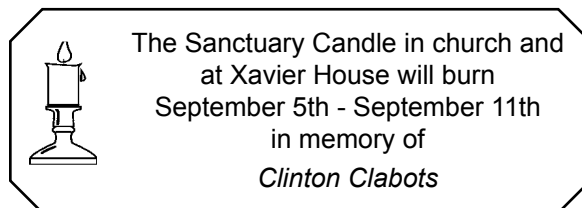

Fr. Patrick was born in Green Bay to Patrick F. and Joanne M. Beno on December 24, 1968. Growing up in the Preble neighborhood, he enjoyed playing at the park as a little boy. He was a St. Bernard Bear for all eight years of grade school. He has two brothers and two sisters and a bunch of nieces and nephews. Mom passed into the care of the Lord a couple years ago – February 9, 2008, which was three days after her birthday.

He is an alumnus of the Franciscan University of Steubenville in Ohio, majoring in history/minoring in English literature. After college he taught fourth grade for five years at Holy Family Academy in Manassas, VA. Deciding then to enter priesthood for the Diocese of Arlington, VA he began studying at Mt. St. Mary's Seminary. Then a transfer back to the Green Bay Diocese had him complete his seminary training at St. Mary of the Lake/Mundelein Seminary. He was the Parochial Vicar at St. John Nepomucene in Little Chute for his first two years followed by four years as the Administrator of Holy Trinity (Oconto), St. Anthony (Oconto Falls), and St. Patrick (Stiles).
